Against the above estimates, Central Government shall provide to the State Government, Rs. 560474.482 lakh as its share (Rs. 526559.036 lakh for Elementary Education, Rs. 20271.62 lakh for Secondary Education and Rs. 13643.826 lakh for Teacher Education). The State

would contribute Rs. 373649.655 lakh as its State share matching the above Central share as per the existing fund sharing pattern of Samagra Shiksha. States and UTs will also be able to utilise their unspent balances as on 31st March, 2020 for the activities approved in 2020-21 including spill over.

The State is advised to ensure adherence to GFR procedure and Financial and Procurement norms of Samagra Shiksha.

3. The State has surrendered the outlay amounting to Rs. 16986.27 lakh for the following activities:-

Para 10.(2)(d): Special Training for age appropriate admission of Out-of-School children (OoSC): An amount of Rs.4823.55 lakh @Rs.4500 for 9 months was estimated for age appropriate admission of 107190 OoSC through residential and non regidential mode, as per norms of the scheme.

Para 10(3): Media and community mobilization (Elementary): An amount of Rs.2394.975 lakh was estimated for Community Mobilization activities @Rs.1500 per school. The funds for media & community mobilization may also be utilized for making members of the community aware about the safeguards required at the time of opening and running of schools to prevent any spread of COVID-19.

Para 10(4): Training and meetings of SMC (Elementary): An outlay of Rs. 4789.95 lakh @ Rs. 3000 per SMC per annum was estimated for training of 159665 SMCs. This includes provision for conducting/convening of SMC meetings on a single notified date by the State once in every quarter, incentivising nominated parents for attending the SMC meeting regularly.

Para 10(9)(b): Self Defence Training (Elementary): An outlay of Rs. 2595.51 lakh @ Rs. 3000/- per month for 3 Months training in self-defence for girls in 28339 elementary schools.

Para 10(9)(e): Life skills for adolescent girls (Elementary): An amount of Rs. 2382.285 lakh @1500/- for 158819 was estimated for adolescent programme of life skills.
