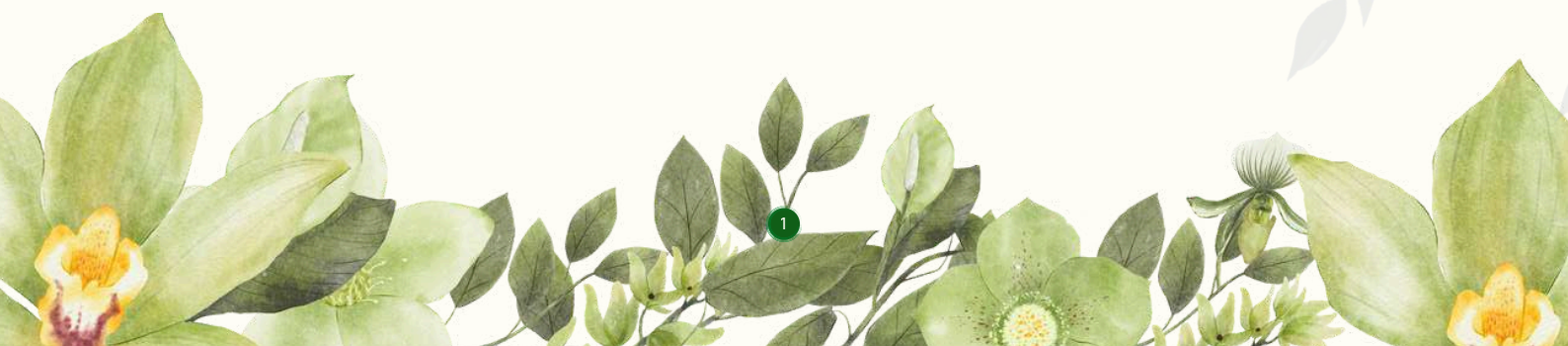
Introduction

Honourable Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi launched “Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam” (Plant4Mother) campaign on the occasion of World Environment Day, 5th June 2024, by planting a Peepal sapling at Buddha Jayanti Park, New Delhi. He exhorted people across the world to plant a tree as a symbol of love and respect for their mothers and as a commitment to protecting Mother Earth. Earlier, the Honourable Prime Minister had launched Mission LiFE during the 26th United Nations Climate Change Conference of the Parties (COP26) at Glasgow in 2021. This India-led global movement is promoting sustainable lifestyle and individual action to combat climate change.

Mission LiFE is being implemented in schools through Eco Clubs for Mission LiFE - an intervention under Samagra Shiksha. Activities of these clubs are aligned with the seven themes of Mission LiFE. The clubs are a significant step towards sensitizing our children to environment and climate change issues and inculcating in them pro-environment attitudes and behaviours. These clubs are enabling students to take up meaningful environmental friendly activities/projects. A dedicated portal (<https://ecoclubs.education.gov.in/>) has been developed to capture the activities of these clubs. Every school is expected to bring out and upload on this portal, a notification in token of having constituted their Eco Club for Mission LiFE.

In 2024, “Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam” campaign was undertaken by the Department of School Education and Literacy, Ministry of Education under the aegis of Eco Clubs for Mission LiFE from 27th July to 30th September, 2024 in schools across the country. The campaign encouraged every school to plant at least 35 saplings within school premises, at home, or at suitable public spaces. During this period, over 5.5 crore saplings were planted across the school ecosystem.

Building upon this momentum, “Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam 2.0” was launched across the nation on World Environment Day, 5th June, 2025, with a target





of 10 crore plantations. The tree plantation drive was carried out in schools across India from 5th June to 10th October 2025, coinciding with the plantation season in different agro-climatic zones. The campaign achieved its goal with the planting of over 10.35 crore saplings in diverse locations, including school campuses, roads leading to schools/homes, neighbourhoods and other public spaces.

This remarkable achievement made “Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam 2.0” one of the largest school-led green movements in the country.

Microsite: Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam 2.0

A dedicated user-friendly microsite was hosted on the Eco Clubs for Mission LiFE web portal (<https://ecoclubs.education.gov.in/>) to facilitate the implementation of “Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam 2.0”. The microsite was AI enabled, ensuring that the selfie has a sapling, student and mother.

Through this microsite, school students who planted a sapling with their mother were able to capture and upload a selfie/photograph of the moment by completing a simple online form. Upon successful submission, an e-certificate of participation featuring the uploaded photograph was generated. The platform also provided real-time data and analytics, enabling the Department of School Education and Literacy to monitor campaign progress at the ground level and also post plantation care and survival of the saplings. Students were encouraged to save or print the certificate as a meaningful memento of their participation in this green initiative.

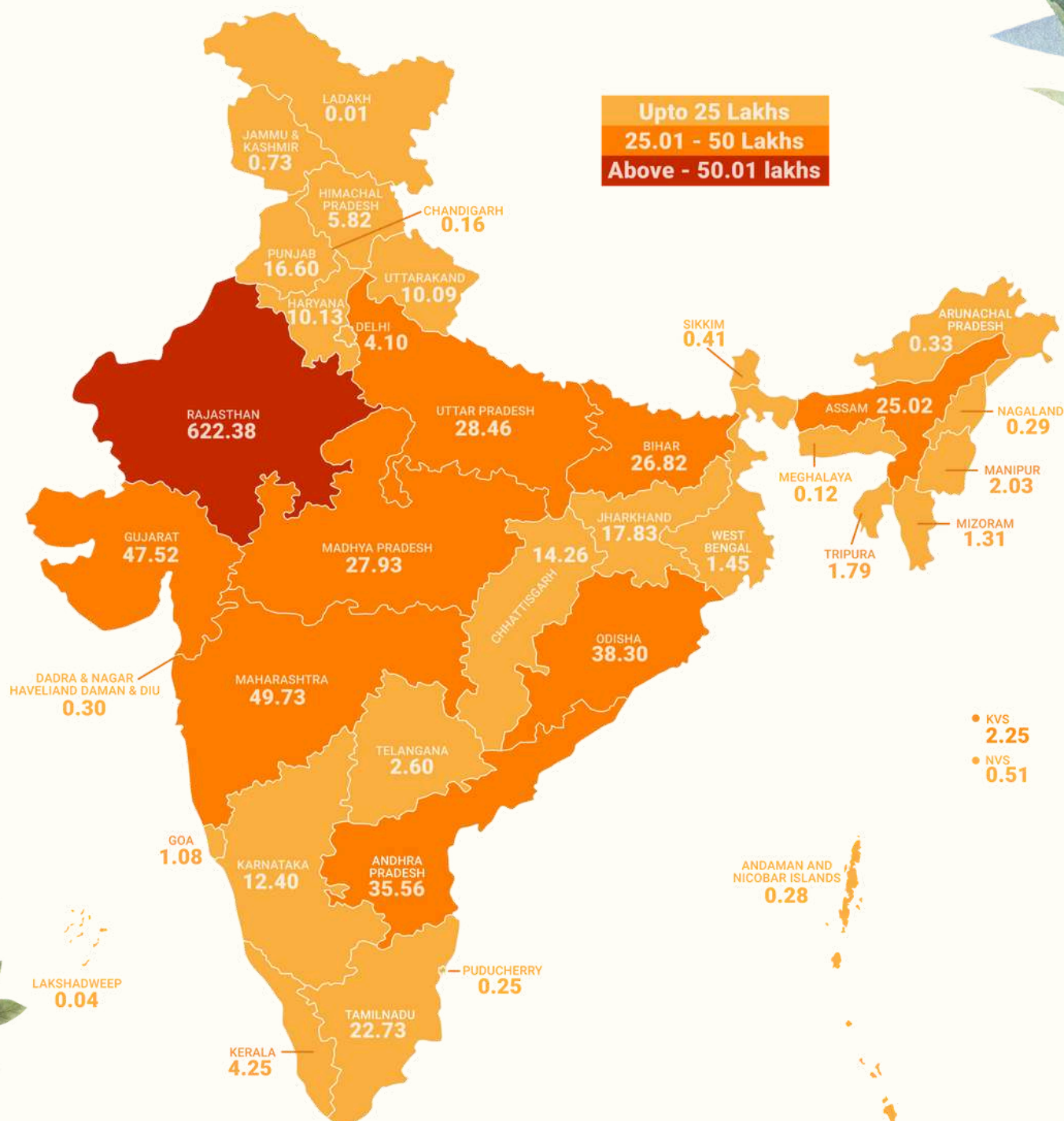

Best Practices

The “Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam” campaign inspired students across the country to plant trees in honour of their mothers, combining care for the environment with cultural values.

As schools across the country actively participated in the campaign, several innovative and effective practices emerged, showcasing creativity, community involvement and commitment to sustainability. The following best practices serve as valuable models for future environmental initiatives.

1. Hariyalo Rajasthan Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam 2.0

“Hariyalo Rajasthan: Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam 2.0” is a green initiative by the Government of Rajasthan aimed at increasing the state’s green cover and fostering environmental responsibility. Under the campaign through Eco Clubs for Mission LiFE established in schools, students and teachers



planted over 6.22 crore saplings in the name of their mothers, symbolizing love, respect, and sustainability. All plantation details are recorded through the State’s Shaladarpan web portal, which also features a dedicated module to monitor sapling survival and facilitate the replacement of non-surviving plants with new ones. In a landmark achievement, Government of Rajasthan revived 17 lakh endangered plants, earning recognition in the World Book of Records, UK as part of this campaign. With participation of 1.05 lakh schools in Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam 2.0, the feat showcases power of collective action and environmental commitment across the State.

2. Amma Peru Tho Oka Mokka (Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam) Green Passport



Department of School Education, Andhra Pradesh, launched 'Green Passport' initiative on 10th July, inspired by 'Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam' and implemented through Eco Clubs for Mission LiFE. The digital program enables students (Classes 4-10) to request, plant and track saplings, earning points for survival and care.

Over 45 lakh Green Passports were distributed across government and private schools and more than 35 lakh saplings planted. Each passport includes plant details, QR codes, and growth records, ensuring continuity even during student transfers. Department has also resolved to plant one crore more saplings as part of its continued efforts towards environmental conservation and sustainability.

3. Seed Ball Movement in Chhattisgarh

Shri Sagar Kumar Sharma (Lecturer, Government Pandit Rambishal Pandey Utkrisht English Medium School, Rajim) along with his colleagues and with the cooperation of students created one lakh seedballs under "Mission One Lakh Seedball" and inspired other schools to conduct similar campaigns. The school distributed these seedballs in government and non-government schools, offices, hospitals and other places in and around Rajim, thereby promoting environmental awareness. During Navratri, students involved in the campaign went to villages, distributed seedballs and provided information at Durga pandals to raise public awareness. The team is linking Eco Clubs for Mission LiFE with the school's NCC and Science & Maths Clubs to foster awareness and action on different themes of Mission LiFE.



Way Forward

Building upon the success of “Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam 2.0”, the campaign aims to widen community engagement in environment friendly activities by involving the community not only in planting trees but also in post plantation care. As per UDISE + 2024-25, over 9.23 lakh schools have Eco Clubs for Mission LiFE. The endeavour is to saturate all schools with these clubs in this financial year by uploading notification on the portal <https://ecoclubs.education.gov.in>. Through these clubs, post plantation care and survival of the saplings planted will be undertaken by the school students under the supervision of the Eco Club for Mission LiFE teacher incharge. School students will be encouraged to regularly record the growth of their saplings, fostering an enduring bond with nature. Additionally, collaboration with local forest departments, Panchayati Raj Institutions and community groups with District Education Officers will help sustain the initiative and expand its reach.

Going forward, “Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam 2.0” seeks to evolve from a one-time plantation drive into a sustained movement promoting environmental stewardship, building a generation of eco warriors and contributing to a greener, more resilient and sustainable future.
