

Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan (KVS)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● “Samvidhan Diwas (Constitution Day)” was celebrated in all Kendriya Vidyalayas across the country. 16814 students participated in Debate Competition and 2,38,203 students participated in Quiz Competition on “India- the Mother of Democracy” with great enthusiasm on the occasion of Samvidhan Diwas (Constitution Day). ● NEP-2020- The details of progress made in this regard upto 30th November, 2022 in respect of various tasks assigned to KVS by the Ministry are as follows: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Task No. 32 (NEP Para 2.2) – Concept-wise modules for Classes I & II have been reviewed and uploaded on FLN blog. For Class III-V preparation of modules is in progress. ○ Task No. 149 (NEP Para 5.8 - 5.14) – Modules for capacity building programme for creating conducive learning environment in schools for teacher and school leader have been developed with the help of experts from NIEPA. These modules are being used during inhouse training of teachers and principals by the Zonal Institute of Education Training of Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan. KVS has also requested CBSE to conduct workshop for Master Trainer in some generic topics for Capacity Building of Teachers. ○ Task No. 153 (NEP Para 5.15 – 5.16 & 5.17 – 5.19) - KVS has its own Training Policy. In order to align it with the recommendations of NEP-2020 a committee has been constituted including member from NCERT to review the existing KVS Training Policy. Modules on creating conducive learning environment in schools for training teachers and school heads have been prepared and will be published in due course of time. KVS Advisory committee of ZIETs meets every year to review the activities and training programmes conducted in previous academic sessions and suggest measures for improvement in the next session(s). ○ Task No. 85 (NEP Para 4.1 – 4.8) – KVS will prepare action plan aligned with the recommendations as per NCFSE as soon as it is published by NCERT. However, KVS has also prepared modules for creating conducive learning environment and continuous professional development of teachers. The same are being used during online/offline mode of training of teachers and school heads. ○ Task No. 145 (5.2 – 5.7) – KVS has given an advertisement in November - 2022 for filling up of 13404 teaching and non-teaching posts in the forthcoming edition dated 3-9 December, 2022. KVS has plan to fill up these vacancies tentatively up to July 2023 after conducting written test, skill test (wherever applicable) and interview. ○ Task No. 178 (NEP Para 6-7 – 6-9) – KVs located in aspirational districts for adding of pre-school section.
