## To implement National Mission for Mentoring, NCTE organises 2 day capacity building workshop for the 60 mentors on 31st May and 1st June 2023

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The National Mission for Mentoring (NMM), as envisaged in NEP 2020, is about the creation of a large pool of outstanding professionals willing to provide mentoring to school teachers and ensure their continuous professional development. These potential mentors, regardless of the age or position of the mentor and mentee, will contribute towards realizing 21<sup>st</sup> century development goals of our nation. National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE) launched NMM in Pilot mode on 29<sup>th</sup> July 2022 in selected 30 Central Schools (15 KVs, 10 JNVs, 5 CBSE) across the country.
